To prepare herself as a third generation Episcopal priest, Hannah earned a bachelor of arts degree in history at Douglass College, Rutgers University, and a master's degree in divinity at the General Theological Seminary in New York in May 1996, with additional master's level studies in theology at Universidad Centroamericana Jesuita in El Salvador.



Before arriving in Houston, Hannah most recently served as Senior Assistant Rector at Saint John's Church, Lafayette Square, Washington, D.C, as part of almost eight years of service there. Before joining the staff of Saint John's she served as Director of Theological and Christian Education in the Diocese of the Episcopal/Anglican Church of El Salvador, Associate Priest at Saint John the Evangelist San Salvador, Priest-in-Charge at Holy Trinity Church Santa Teresa in San Martin, San Salvador, and as Interim Priest-in-Charge at Saint Andrew's Church in Amatepec, Soyapango, El Salvador. Reverend Atkins is married to Elmer Romero and they have sons, one in kindergarten and one in preschool.

WORSHIP & SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

This month we have seasonal and special opportunities for worship and service:

Friday, January 1: Holy Name

10:00a Holy Eucharist, Rite II: The commemoration of Jesus' receiving of a name in the Temple, eight days after his birth. Prayers will also be offered in thanksgiving for year passed, and in petition for the new year.

Sunday, January 3: II Christmas

All Services During the Christmas season we will celebrate Holy Eucharist, praying Morning and Evening Prayers before the Holy Communion. This form of worship provides an opportunity to share in the richness of our Prayer Book tradition.

Wednesday, January 6: Epiphany

6:00p Holy Eucharist, Rite II: The Christmas season concludes as we remember the visit of the Magi, led by the star of Bethlehem to the infant Jesus.

Wednesday, January 20: The Ordination to the Priesthood of Chris Duncan

7:00p Holy Eucharist, Rite II, & Ordination of a Priest: God willing, the Rt. Rev. Dena A. Harrison will ordain the Rev. Deacon Chris Duncan to the priesthood. Ordinations are occasions of celebration for not only the ordinand, but for the whole Body of Christ. Please join Chris, his family, and your parish family, as we celebrate together. A reception will follow.

Saturday, January 23: Eucharistic Minister & Worship Leader Brunch

9:30a At Good Shepherd, Eucharistic Ministers assist at the altar and in the administration of Communion, most often by serving the chalice of wine. Worship Leaders read the lessons and lead the Prayers of the People. This morning we will gather for brunch and instruction as we prepare new and continuing members for diocesan licensure.

Sunday, January 24: New & Continuing Usher Instruction

12:15p After the 11:10a, we will gather in the Church for the instruction of new and continuing Ushers. If you would like to join the ranks of our Ushers, please come this early afternoon in order that you can be assigned to a team and learn about this ministry of service and hospitality.

CHILDREN

Continuing our increased participation in worship, our Children's Choirs will lead the January 10 Evensong. The anthem will be the beautiful setting of Psalm 84: 1-4 by German composer, Felix Mendelssohn. The text of this anthem speaks of the joy found in God's house and the inclusive welcome God gives to everyone, even the lowly sparrow and swallow. In preparation for Evensong, the Children's Choirs will rehearse on Sunday, January 3, 10:45a—1:00p.



Good Shepherd's Children's ministries will start the new year with exciting activities! In January, our Preschoolers will learn about Jesus as a boy. Although there is not much information in the Bible about Jesus' young years, we do know of an eventful family trip to the temple in Jerusalem during which the young Jesus was found teaching the elders about God. We'll also celebrate family, including learning about Jesus' own cousin, John the Baptist, and how God used John to help prepare the way for Jesus.

In Children's Sunday School, our Kindergarten – 5th Grade students will begin a study on Communion: Why do we take Communion and why is it so central to our faith? Our central themes will be: commitment to God, commitment to setting Jesus' love into action, and commitment to one another as fellow believers.

The GS Singles' Group meets monthly and seeks to serve all single persons, whether one be young or old; divorced, widowed, or never married; looking for partnership or simply looking to share time with friends.

OUTREACH

Good Shepherd Church belongs to the West Austin, Faith in Action Caregivers, a network of congregations working to provide a range of volunteer services to older adults in our community. FIAC-WA helps senior adults maintain and improve their quality of life, specifically assisting in ways that enable independent living.

While FIAC-WA volunteers make home visits, do minor home repairs, and provide reassurance calls, the organization's main focus is the provision of rides for those 60 and older who are no longer able to drive. Transportation to medical appointments, grocery stores, and other local activities are provided at no charge to clients by volunteer drivers. In 2008 FIAC-WA helped volunteers connect with 354 enrolled clients by arranging almost 5,700 rides! You may be called to participation:

This month, Good Shepherd will collect gently-used women's professional clothing for Dress for Success, a non-profit group which provides professional attire for job interviews and work to needy women who can really use them. Dress for Success serves clients only by referral, and the women must have a job interview scheduled before receiving clothing. Clients come from various agency referrals, homeless shelters, immigration services, and domestic violence shelters, such as Safe Place. The women are furnished not only clothing, but shoes, accessories, and even makeup if needed. Dress for Success will use whatever you can donate, and is especially in need of larger, or plus-sized clothing at this time. Please bring your donation dry-cleaned and ready for wear.

HOW TO DONATE SUNDAY FLOWERS

Flowers are one of the ways in which we enrich the worship of our church. Anyone may provide for Sunday arrangements (the minimum donation is \$250), and choose to honor a friend or family member; remember an anniversary or a birthday; or to memorialize a loved one. Sunday flowers continue their service during the week as they are re-arranged and taken to sick and homebound parishioners. Please consider donating an entire floral arrangement or contributing to the flower fund of the parish, so that your gift, in combination with those of others, can keep this ministry ongoing.

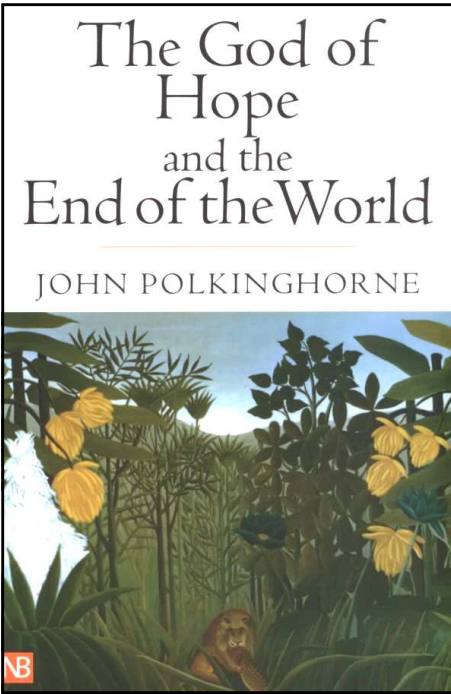

ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



Are science and faith incompatible?
Do you believe in destiny?
How will the world end?

Sparked from discussions during Advent, our weekday study groups will consider the eschaton — the fulfillment of time — employing John Polkinghorne's *The God of Hope and the End of the World* as a guide. Both groups will take off the week of January 11, returning for the week of January 18, and reading according to the following schedule:

An Anglican, Polkinghorne approaches Christianity from his perspective as a physicist, his science challenging his faith, and his faith wrestling his science. This 2002 book is a readable, imaginative exploration of not only this world, but the world to come.
