The main part of the organ is housed in attic-level chambers on either side of the chancel, the Choir on the north [N], and the Swell on the [S], with the Great divided and standing in front of the swell boxes and the Pedal divided and located within the swell boxes. A floating Positive Organ (including the Trompette) stands unencased in the rear gallery [G]. The Pedal Principal 16', a later addition, stands in the north transept.
